History: Clinton Crane was a major force in the development of Corinthian yachting, a gentleman yacht designer, active 6 metre campaigner. Clytie II was designed by Mr. Crane for Henry B. Plant. Among the other regular regattas, such as Larchmont Race Week, there were trials in 1927 to put up a defense of the Seawanhaka International Challenge Cup, and defender trials to represent the USA in the Scandinavian Gold Cup. Clytie II joined an already seasoned and vibrant group of six metres and that year was transformational with the first time use of an overlapping "genoa" jib. Clytie II continued to compete through the late 20's and early 30's, including the 1928 Mid-Winter races in Los Angeles, CA. In 1932 Clytie II was fitted with a Sparkman & Stephens designed cabin and interior. Owned & sailed by Percy Murnane, she hailed from New England through the 1990's. Clytie II was largely rebuilt by Scott Lorraine, with almost all of her frames and much of her planking replaced. She most recently was owned & campaigned by Ken Welch of Mattapoisett, MA. She raced multiple Opera House Cup regattas in Nantucket. She along with two other Crane 6 metre designs qualifies to compete for any Rule 2 trophy.
